

Course description

The Clown Within

Clowning is a state of playfulness that brings us to experience a childlike, naïve and vulnerable state of being ... and paradoxically we grow, learn and are strengthened through reconnecting playfully with what makes us most vulnerable. Our approach to clowning is not a technique (tricks, gags and routines) but a personal journey towards finding one's own unique way of being a clown. By listening and being receptive we learn essential skills for creative and imaginative expression. It is only when we let go our control over things that we begin to be surprised by what reveals itself to us.

Working with warm-ups, games and on the empty stage, we will find our inner clowns through improvisation, play and welcoming everything that emerges.



What happens in a workshop

We work in a group of no more than 12 people.

We warm up with physical and vocal games and exercises. We continue with improvisations on a stage - alone or with others. Each improvisation is discussed to identify and bring out the positive and important aspects of our clown and how it lives in us.

This is done with care and respect for each individual and within a framework of rules that ensures a secure and protected environment.



Level 2 shifts the focus towards structure and relationship. The more demanding aspects of this level come from a need to practice a responsiveness to and awareness of your partner on stage, your audience and the images, stories and characters that emerge during improvisation.



LEVEL 3 - Social clowning

Level 3 borrows its techniques from the traditions of the Court Jester and the Fool.

At this level, we learn how:

- o by holding a mirror to life, the clown frees us to laugh at distorted reflections of ourselves and our world
- by putting the human heart back at the centre of life, the clown can reclaim and celebrate its paradoxes
- by juggling with social, symbolic and archetypal references, the clown exposes truths others dare not or cannot speak out.
- by parodying the games of knowledge and power, the clown reveals not only the light and the shadows of our world but also affirms and celebrates our humanity.

Our guideline at this level is to free and renew the creative processes within ourselves and explore how to bring the clown's playful irreverence at the service of our relationship with others and within institutions
